WHAT IS IMAGINATION LIBRARY?



Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is an early literacy initiative that provides new, age-appropriate books each month to children birth to age five – free of charge.

The Imagination Library program in Greater Duluth is made possible through the support of a community-wide coalition of individuals, business, health care, nonprofit, government and literacy professionals.

All families in Greater Duluth, (and in Cook and Lake Counties as of August 1, 2009) with children under the age of five are eligible to enroll in the program.

HOW DO I ENROLL A CHILD?

Parents and guardians can enroll children age birth through five in one of the following ways:

- » Online at www.unitedwayduluth.org
- » By completing a registration form which is available at Duluth Super One stores and the Duluth Public Library

Children receive their first book within eight to ten weeks after enrollment, and will continue to receive a book each month until the age of five as long as they reside in the service area.

WHY IS IMAGINATION LIBRARY IMPORTANT?

The early years are the learning years, and early investment in a child matters to everyone.

- » A child who has trouble reading in 3rd grade is less likely to graduate from high school. When kids can't catch up in school, we all pay the price.
- » The birth to age six years are the most crucial for the beneficial development of the individual, as well as the prevention of later destructive behaviors.
- » By the time a child reaches age six, they have in place fundamental traits that greatly affect their prospects to either succeed or fail throughout life.
